participating in the Greek Olympic



CHALLENGER CENTER

On Thursday, the 7th and 8th grade students went on a field trip to the Challenger Center where they learned how to land a rocket on the moon. At the Challenger Center, the students had different jobs in the simulation on both the rocket and mission control. Some of the teams were the coms team, the navigation team, the geography team, the weather team, and the bot team. Each team had designated jobs to complete to land safely on the moon and send a rover out to explore the lava tubes.
