Several criteria are used in the recipient selection of this award. The person demonstrates, through his or her lifestyle, a commitment to the Lordship of Jesus Christ. The person has, over an extended period of time, displayed service to our community through participation on various community boards and committees and has participated in community service projects. They have made a positive contribution to the economic and social health of the community through involvement in the social, business, religious or educational segments of the community. The Board of Trustees of Tennessee Christian Preparatory School makes this annual selection.

Several months ago, in October, I invited a speaker to visit our chapel service. As I made an emotional introduction that day, I said to our students: Students, you will discover as you go through school and throughout life, you will find friends that make a lasting impression. Many friends will come and go and you will figure out that they are in your life for a season, or for a specific purpose. If you are really blessed, you will find a friend that becomes a lifelong friend, one that no matter how many years go by, they stay the same. It can be months or even years before you see one another, and you immediately pick up right where you left off. Like you never missed a beat. Almost like you've talked every day since you've been apart.

My husband, Marty, some of know as Mr. Sluder, our students know him as Pop. Well, Pop. made friends with a guy many, many years ago. They became best of friends. They rode motorcycles together, drove fast cars, spent lots of time together, worked at the Shake Shack, they were inseparable. They were even friends after the other guy got married and had his first child, Amy. Through the years, they kept up with each other from afar and occasionally they would see each other out, since both remained in Cleveland. They lost touch while he was making his way as a businessman as a contractor and developer, but their friendship has spanned more than 50 years now. During the chapel service, I played a video for our 6 th through 12 th grade students that explained this man's life, how he grew up, where he had been, how he had reached the lowest of lows when he lost everything. If you have never been in that place, it's difficult for you to grasp how that really feels, to feel completely hopeless and that the sun will not come up tomorrow. On a very low and lonely night, when he contemplated ending it all, God spoke to him in multiple ways that would astound you if I told you what happened. Since that time, he picked himself up with God's help and His grace, he rebuilt his business, and he founded U-Turn Institute to help others who needed to hear that it's okay to not be okay. Because he has given God all the glory and praise this time around, his business has exceeded his grandest dreams and he has given and given and given to this community, feeding families in Cleveland and Bradley County that otherwise wouldn't have a Thanksgiving meal, feeding law enforcement officers, hospital workers, firefighters, and given money to support missions trips. Most of what he

has done, no one in this community even knows. He silently and quietly does everything he can to help those who are hurting and suffering and probably has one of the most tender hearts I've ever known. Most of you know that I am not usually speechless, but I don't even have the words to tell you how honored I am to present the 2023 Spirit of Service Award to Mr. Lynn Jones. His daughter, Amy, and her husband, Blake are also here this evening.
