the students to be willing to allow Christ to wash their feet,



She underwent surgery in February of 2022 and began extensive rehab. Sidelined through basketball season, you could find her sitting at each game, cheering on her teammates and wishing she was on the court. Through a difficult rehab, Ashlyn trusted the process. As a young person, it is hard to fully understand the marathon it is to heal from injuries. Ashlyn persevered, attending physical therapy, listening to instructions, and following doctors' orders.

This past week, Ashlyn was able to perform athletically for the first time since the injury sidelined her a year ago. In a golf match versus Copper Basin, the top opponent scored a 60, Ashlyn, a 45! A full 15 strokes in the lead! Later that week, in a tri-school match against Tellico Plains High School and Meigs County High School, Ashlyn again was the winner with a score of 46!
