
Class of 2016, came and worked with the students to help them understand their tastebuds and how their senses impact their enjoyment of coffee.

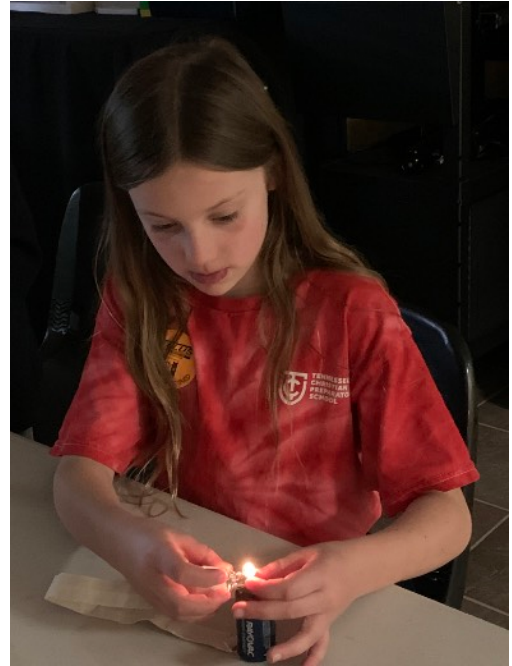
International Food and Culture
