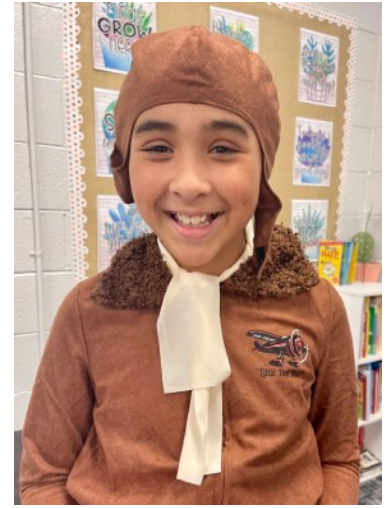
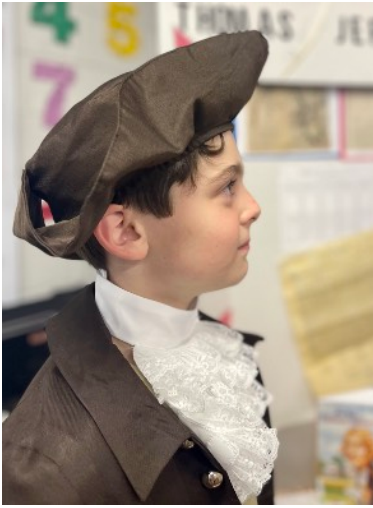

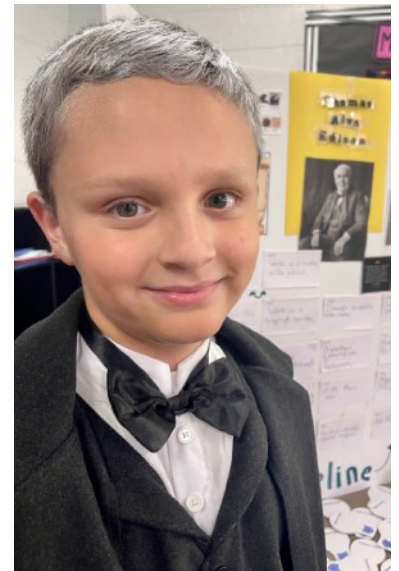


LOWER SCHOOL - NIGHT AT THE MUSEUM


MIDDLE SCHOOL BONFIRE
