Campus SAH

Tennessee Christian has been working hard this summer to pursue extra measures of safety for our students. Our school has submitted our intent to participate in the Tennessee Non-public School Security Grant. But not only this, our leadership team has met with security officials, private companies, and experienced professionals about protecting our students. A vital component of this is a School Resource Officer (SRO). This individual is, precisely as the name implies, a resource for the school to utilize for campus safety. The school's leadership team met with Allen Huggins and his team with River City Security and Investigations to determine if their company could fulfill our security needs. Allen Huggins' company provides individuals with equipment and training specific to schools, and the company goes beyond the required state training to ensure their professionals are prepared for all situations. Tennessee Christian has partnered with River City Security to provide a safe environment for all our students starting this August. Along with contracting with a professional group that can provide layers of security on campus, the leadership team has provided physical improvements to critical locations on campus, including further security cameras and additional eyes watching our campus.
