
from the Head

In the autumn of 1621, select members of the Wampanoag tribe and the remaining 52 of the 102 Mayflower travelers joined together in a multiple-day-long celebration of a successful fall harvest. As our school breaks for Thanksgiving next week and celebrates the holiday, let us remember the importance of the tradition that traces its roots back to 1621: community.

Community is at the bedrock of the Christ faith. As Christ declared His ministry after His baptism, He gathered disciples to His cause, creating community. 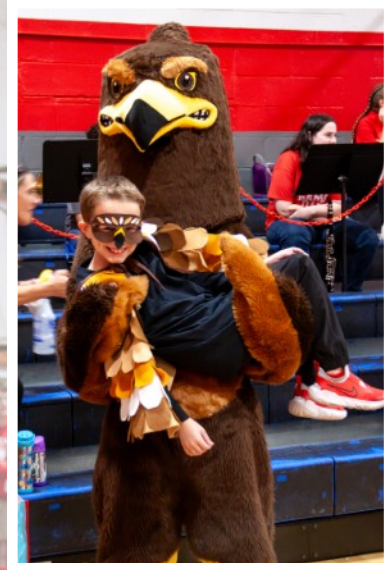

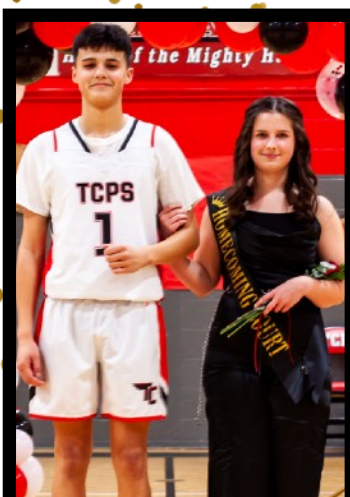

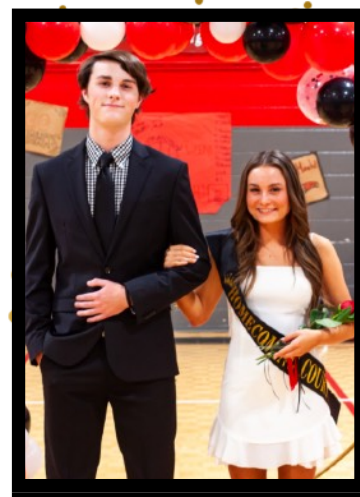
